Promises to Shut Up Jews Slandering Lithuanians

The Center for the Study of the Genocide and Resistance of Lithuanian Residents plans to place a full stop on the study of the Holocaust and finally disperse the false accusations constantly being hurled around that Lithuanians are a nation of Jew killers.

This will be one of the priority tasks of the center next year, center director Terese Birute Burauskaite told the Lithuanian parliament Tuesday.

“We endeavor to finally study these lists of Lithuanian Jew-shooters which are often posted on the internet, let’s say, on an Israeli internet page, and other ... accusations leveled at us, that allow some to come to the conclusion that almost the entire nation was in favor of or participated in Jew-shooting. We want to investigate these things and to specifically say: yes, this number of Lithuanian residents have bloody hands, but these surnames are

extraneous, these people are falsely accused, and to once and for all put an end to it. And if someone doubts our lists, we will ask them to present specific arguments and documents supporting the accusation,” Burauskaite said.

Vakaro Zinios reported (May 27, 2009) on the newest list of “Jew-shooters” posted by Israel which includes prominent partisans, defenders of the Lithuanian state.

The Association of Lithuanian Jews in Israel posted an article on its website with a list of three thousand Lithuanians damned by God and called Jew-shooters. The list of the damned includes brigadier general Adolfas Ramanauskas-Vanagas, recipient of the Lithuanian order the Cross of Vytis for service to the Lithuanian state; brigadier general Juozas Barzda-Bradauskas decorated multiple times; partisan Juozas Luksa-Daumantas and a multitude of Lithuanian patriots from that period.

If Lithuania published similar information on the alleged crimes of representatives of some other state, naming specific perpetrators but without any proof of those acts, those states would truly push Lithuania up against the wall and spew [diplomatic] notes [of protest]. [They] would demand accountability for sowing discord among nations, libel and so on.

So far the Prosecutor General hasn’t investigated anything and the Lithuanian Foreign Ministry has sent no [protest] note to Israel.
